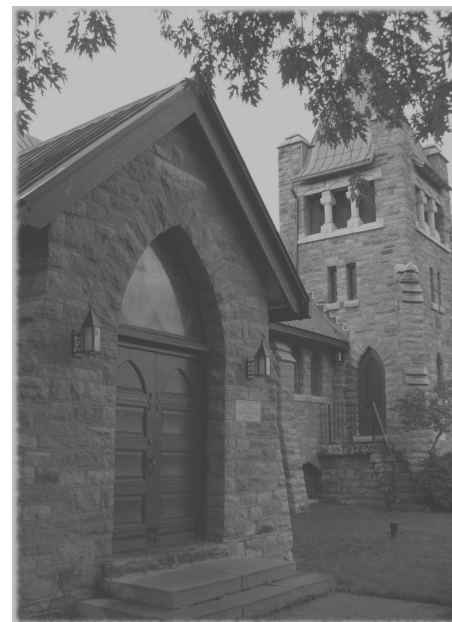

Lectionary readings for Advent 3, December 17th: Isaiah 12: 2-6, Psalm 126, Philemon 4: 4-7, Luke 3: 7-18

The first Sunday in Advent (December 2nd) marks the beginning of the third year (Year C) of our three year cycle of lectionary readings each Sunday. These readings are read and heard each Sunday by over one million Christians around the world who all share in using this common lectionary. Year C will use Gospel readings primarily from Luke’s Gospel, whereas last year (Year B) we read most of Mark’s gospel.

**The Advent Wreath:** The tradition of an Advent wreath began in many German Lutheran homes in the 19<sup>th</sup> century and then was gradually transferred to churches as a way of marking each of the four Sundays of Advent and preparing to welcome Christ on December 25<sup>th</sup>. While there is no hard and fast rule about the colour of the candles, a custom has developed in using three blue or purple candles, a fourth pink or rose one and a fifth white one in the middle which marks the season of Christmas. This year, we will use the advent wreath from St. John the Baptist, Iroquois.
